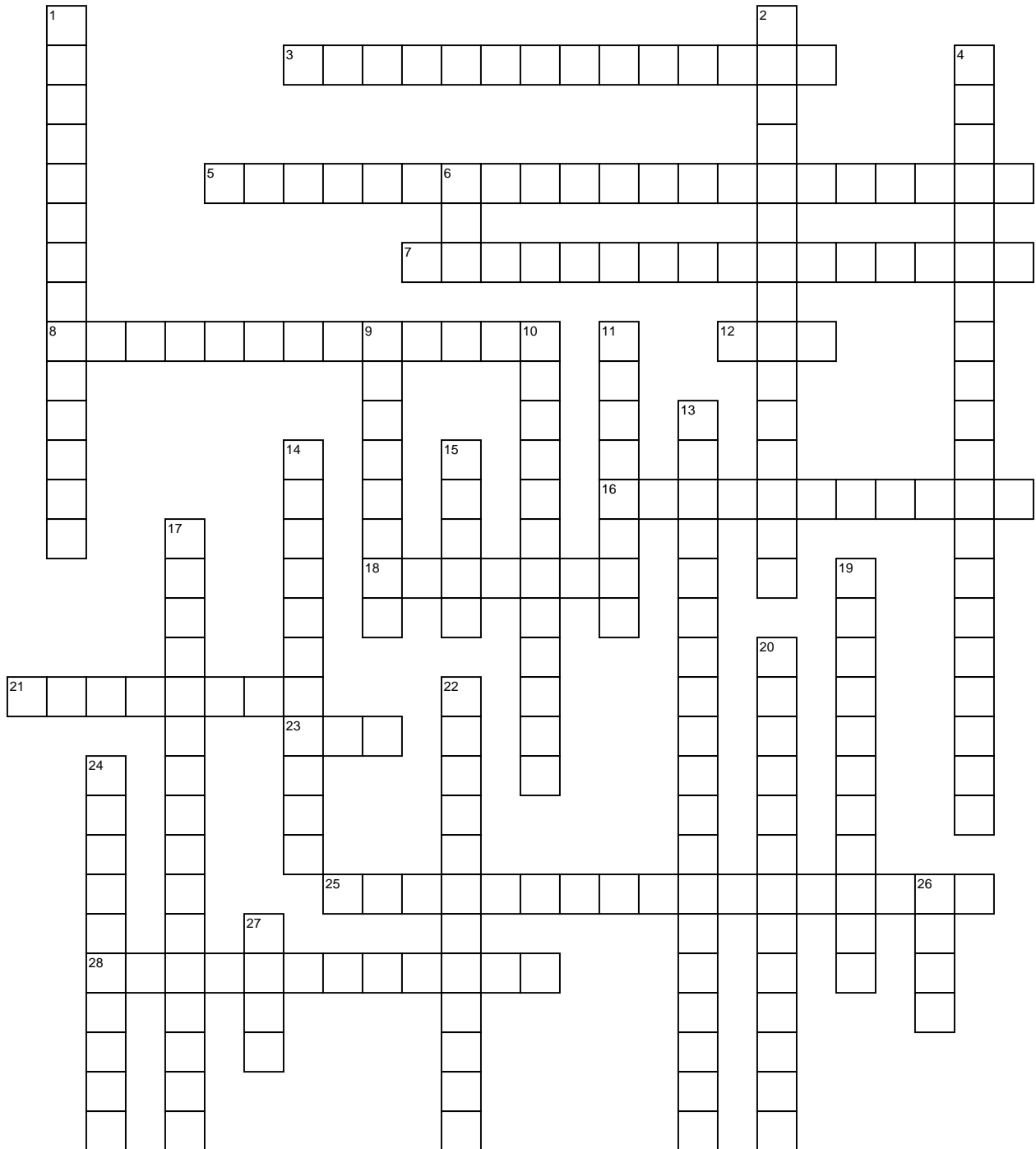

ACROSS

- 3 Nixon's National Security Advisor
- 5 homosexuals began an effort to win social and legal acceptance and to encourage gays to affirm their sexual identity.
- 7 a break-in at the Democratic National Committee offices in the Watergate complex in Washington was carried out under the direction of white House employees.
- 8 general rise in temperatures, believed by most scientists to be caused by human activities causing the greenhouse effect
- 12 a measure designed to guarantee women equal treatment under the law. Never adopted.
- 16 the leaders of a leftist regime in Nicaragua that developed close ties with Cuba
- 18 relaxation of tension with the Soviet Union as a way to lessen the possibility of nuclear war
- 21 White House counsel who refused to play the role of scapegoat and revealed the president's involvement in the cover-up
- 23 a federal agency involved in plots to assassinate foreign leaders
- 25 the use of laws or regulations to achieve racial, ethnic, or gender as in hiring or school admissions.
- 28 Watergate special prosecutor, fired by Nixon for demanding release of presidential papers

DOWN

- 1 in the election of 1972, he ran on a platform advocating a negotiated settlement in Vietnam, the right to abortion, and tolerance of diverse life styles
- 2 denounced liberal for being too soft on the communist threat abroad and too willing to compromise high standards at home in the face of demands for equality from African Americans, women and the disadvantaged.
- 4 the American embassy in Tehran was seized and fifty-three American diplomats held hostage for over a year.
- 6 government program to protect the environment and curb the pollution of the nation's air and water
- 9 women had a constitutional right to abortion during the early stages of pregnancy
- 10 White House "plumber" who plotted the Watergate break-in
- 11 Foreign competition proved damaging for this American car corporation and only government backed loans helped them stave off bankruptcy
- 13 Four student protesters from here were killed by National Guardsmen breaking up a demonstration
- 14 a small microprocessor that sped complex calculations for computers
- 15 recognized the existing Soviet lead in missiles but the American deployment of multiple independently targeted reentry vehicles ensured an advantage for the U.S.
- 17 a peace agreement between the leaders of Egypt and Israel
- 19 invasion of this country seemed to be the beginning of a Soviet thrust toward the Indian Ocean and Persian Gulf
- 20 fundamentalist group dedicated to preserving the "American way of life"
- 22 attorney general and head of Nixon's reelection committee later receiving a jail term for his role in Watergate
- 24 forced to resign in order to avoid prosecution for accepting bribes while he was governor of Maryland
- 26 cartel of oil exporting nations
- 27 disease of the immune system transmitted through blood, especially by sexual contact or contaminated needles.
